foundation model

Basic AI structure that is pre-trained with massive amounts of data to perform many different tasks.

edge computing

Gaining speed by processing data at the point closest to the device itself, instead of remote servers at the center.

CRM

Management system that allows companies to track their interactions and historical information with their customers in one place.

OSINT

A method of collecting and analyzing information from publicly available sources on the Internet.

browser state

All stored information of your internet browser, such as currently open tabs, cookies and the accounts you are logged into.

AI agents

Autonomous artificial intelligence software that makes decisions on its own and uses tools to achieve certain goals.

spec-driven development

The process of determining all technical requirements and rules in detail before starting to code the software.

GPU

Special processor used to process images on a computer and speed up heavy mathematical calculations such as artificial intelligence.

LLM

Artificial intelligence models trained with huge data that can understand human language and produce text.

RAG

A method that allows artificial intelligence to benefit from current and private documents in addition to its own knowledge when producing answers.

plugin specification

A set of technical rules that must be followed in order to make an external add-on to a software.

graph-native

A special database structure that stores and processes data based on their relationships with each other.

fine-tuning

The process of retraining a general-purpose trained artificial intelligence with a small data set to make it more expert on a specific subject.

cyber capabilities

Technical capabilities and tools used to protect or interfere with digital systems.

large language model

Artificial intelligence models trained with huge data that can understand human language and produce text.

FP8

A data format that represents numbers in a smaller footprint to make AI calculations faster.

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
