meta-framework

More comprehensive development platform built on top of core software tools that make creating websites easier.

plugin specification

A set of technical rules that must be followed in order to make an external add-on to a software.

foundation model

The main model that forms the basis of artificial intelligence systems, trained on huge data to perform a wide range of tasks.

large language models

Artificial intelligence models trained with huge data that can understand human language and produce text.

diffusion models

Artificial intelligence technology that can produce high-quality images or content based on noisy data.

fine-tuning

The process of retraining a general-purpose trained artificial intelligence model on a small data set to specialize in a specific subject.

API

A digital bridge that allows two different software to talk to each other and exchange data.

layer streaming

Instant loading of a large data or software layer in parts, without waiting for the entire software layer to be downloaded.

spec-driven development

A method of defining in detail the rules and standards that determine how the system will work before starting to write the software code.

on-device STT

Technology that converts spoken audio into text directly on the device, without the need for the Internet.

CLI

Text-based interface that runs programs with written commands rather than the mouse.

framework

A structural framework containing ready-made code blocks and rules used to speed up software development.

agent-native

Artificial intelligence-driven system design that can make decisions and take action on its own, instead of just waiting for human commands.

working memory

Short-term memory area where artificial intelligence temporarily stores the information it needs during the current process.

dementia

A condition in which memory, thinking and daily living skills are seriously weakened as a result of damage to nerve cells in the brain.

generative AI

A type of artificial intelligence that can create new content such as text, images or sound that has never existed before.
