Prompt as Code

The method of managing commands given to AI by versioning and testing them like software code.

prompt engineering

The art of writing prompts most effectively to get the most accurate and high-quality responses from AI.

skills

Special capabilities or tools that AI models have to perform specific tasks.

local-first

A software approach where data is stored and processed on the user's own device before needing the internet.

DPI

A measure of dot density that determines how sharp and detailed an image a screen or printer can produce.

hive mind

Many interconnected AI units acting together like a single center to form a collective intelligence.

append-only

A record system where existing information cannot be changed or deleted and only new data can be appended.

IDE

An integrated development environment where developers can find all the tools they need while writing code in one place.

token

The smallest unit the AI uses when processing text, corresponding to words or sub-word pieces.

AI coding agents

Autonomous AI assistants that can write code on their own, fix bugs, and manage software projects.

swarms

Many small AI units that communicate and coordinate with each other to solve complex problems.

RAG

A method that enables AI to produce more accurate answers by fetching data from current or private documents outside of its own knowledge.

agent skills

Capabilities that allow AI agents to interact with the outside world, such as searching the web or manipulating files.

SaaS

A service model where you use software via monthly or annual subscription over the internet instead of installing it on your computer.

PaaS

The delivery of infrastructure and tools over the internet needed for developers to build their own applications.

IaaS

The virtual rental over the internet of fundamental hardware resources like servers, storage, and networking.

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
