A foundational artificial intelligence structure pre-trained with massive amounts of data to perform many different tasks.

Chrome DevTools

Model Context Protocol

A common connection language that allows artificial intelligence systems to communicate with different data sources in a secure and standardized way.

continuous learning

The process of a system continuing to learn by constantly updating itself as it encounters new information.

inference server

A powerful computer system that runs a trained artificial intelligence model to generate instant answers to incoming questions.

source control

A tracking system that records all changes made while developing software and is used to manage different versions.

serialization

The conversion of a complex data structure into a flat text or byte sequence so that it can be moved or saved elsewhere.

microservices

A method of managing large software by breaking it down into small, independent parts, each of which runs on its own.

token

The smallest unit of meaning, corresponding to words or syllables, used by artificial intelligence models when processing texts.

AI agents

Autonomous artificial intelligence programs that can make decisions on their own and perform tasks by using tools to reach specific goals.

framework

A basic framework that facilitates tasks while developing software, offering a set of ready-made code structures and rules.

generative AI

Technology capable of creating new texts, images, or sounds that did not exist before, based on the data it has learned.

data processing

The process of organizing raw information and transforming it into meaningful results that can be analyzed or used.

ad tech

Digital tools used for delivering, managing, and measuring advertisements on the internet to a target audience.

text generation

The computer's ability to generate content by forming natural and meaningful sentences in accordance with the commands given to it.

multimodal model

Artificial intelligence capable of understanding and processing not only text but also different types of data such as images, audio, and video simultaneously.

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
