A remote code execution vulnerability found and actively used in all Chromium-based browsers can disable the sandbox mechanism. Since this security vulnerability allows attackers to perform unauthorized operations on user computers, browser updates must be performed immediately.

scripts

Short and sequential command sequences given to a computer to perform a specific task automatically.

skills

Special capabilities or tool-use skills acquired by artificial intelligence models to perform a specific task.

coding agent

Autonomous software that independently manages software development processes, writes code, and fixes bugs.

swarms

Multiple artificial intelligence units working in coordination by communicating with each other to solve complex problems.

RAG

A method that enables artificial intelligence to provide more accurate answers by retrieving information from current or private sources outside of its own training data.

LLM

An advanced artificial intelligence model trained on vast amounts of data that can understand human language and generate text.

generative AI

Artificial intelligence technology capable of creating new content such as text, images, or audio that did not exist before.

hooks

Connection points that allow intervention in a process by activating at a specific point during the operation of a software.

inference server

A server system that enables a trained artificial intelligence model to generate instant responses to incoming queries.

PoC

A small-scale preliminary trial conducted to see if an idea or technology works in practice.

AI agents

Intelligent software that can make decisions on its own, use tools in line with its goals, and complete tasks.

remote code execution

The situation of taking control of a computer or server via remotely sent commands.

sandbox

An isolated workspace where new software can be safely tested without damaging the main system.

instances

Each independent copy of a software or system running at the same time.

multimodal AI

Artificial intelligence capable of processing different data types such as visual, audio, and video, not just text, simultaneously.

large language model

Artificial intelligence models trained on vast amounts of data that can understand human language and generate text.

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
