A database system that visualizes and organizes the relationships between information in the form of a network structure.

RAG

Technology that allows artificial intelligence to extract information from current and private documents while producing answers.

generative AI

Systems that can produce new content such as text, visuals or sound by using previously learned data.

large language models

Artificial intelligence models trained with huge data that can understand human language and produce text.

diffusion models

Artificial intelligence technology that creates high-quality visuals from scratch by cleansing noisy data step by step.

benchmark

Standard tests used to measure the performance of different systems or software.

RAM

It is a temporary memory unit where the computer can quickly read and write the data it is currently actively using.

spatial reasoning

The ability to mentally grasp the position of objects in space, their size, and their motion relative to each other.
