04 Inject, Align, Recover: Staged Post-Training for Retrieval-Free Document Knowledge Internalization

The IAR (Inject, Align, and Recover) approach is a three-stage training framework that enables large language models to internalize information from specific documents without outsourcing. This method aims to make the model more successful in question-answer processes that do not require document access (retrieval) by transforming a fixed data set into parametric information.
