ad blocker

A browser extension that prevents unwanted advertisements on websites from loading.

recursive reproduction number

The growth rate ratio that occurs during an artificial intelligence system's self-replication and improvement process.

looped transformer

An artificial intelligence architecture that consumes less memory by using the same processing layers repeatedly.

mixture-of-experts

A system that uses small sub-models, each specialized in a different subject, together to solve complex tasks.
