05 X-AuT: Progressive Audio-Encoder Compression for Speech LLMs with Cross-Scale Distillation

skills

The specific capabilities a piece of software or artificial intelligence possesses to perform a particular task.

PBR

A rendering method that makes three-dimensional objects appear according to real-world light and material properties.

AI gateway

A gateway that manages access to different artificial intelligence services and controls security and speed.

Mixture of Experts

A technique for running a large artificial intelligence model by dividing it into smaller parts, each specialized in different subjects.

multi-agent

Multiple artificial intelligence units that communicate with each other to work toward a common goal.

RAG

A method that allows artificial intelligence to provide more accurate answers by retrieving information from current or private documents outside of its own knowledge base.

agent skills

Actions that artificial intelligence software can perform in the outside world, such as browsing the internet or organizing files.

native

A version of software developed to be fully compatible with the operating system of the device it runs on and to operate at peak performance.
