LLM

Artificial intelligence models trained on massive data that can understand human language and generate text.

spec-driven development

A development method that defines how the system will work with detailed rules before starting to write code.

spaced repetition

A learning technique that ensures information is repeated at specific intervals to prevent it from being forgotten.

context engine

A system that provides past conversations and current information to artificial intelligence so it can give more accurate answers.

object storage system

A large-scale storage method that stores data with unique identifiers instead of a file hierarchy.

backend

The background part of the software that the user does not see, where data is processed and runs on the server.

API

An interface that acts as a bridge, allowing two different software programs to exchange data with each other.

AOSP

The open-source version of the operating system used on smartphones.

localhost

The state of software running only on the computer currently in use, without connecting to the internet.

monitoring tool

Software that continuously monitors whether systems are functioning correctly and provides alerts in case of errors.
